During the Fall Season of 2012 Fr. Wise will lead a Pilgrimage from OLM to Rome and Assisi. This spiritual journey will lead us to celebrate mass at St's Peter's in Rome, participate in a Papal Audience, visit the major Basilicas, and explore the oldest existing church in Rome, plus much more including a visit to the Bleeding Host in Oviato. In Assisi we will visit the tomb of St. Francis of Assisi and absorb the peace of Christ that has settled there. Begin planning for this spiritual journey. Further details will follow.

A QUOTE FROM THE HOLY FATHER

"Many generations of pilgrims", he added, "have made their way to Rome from all over the Christian world, in order to venerate the tombs of the holy Apostles Peter and Paul, and thereby to deepen their communion in the one Church of Christ, founded on the Apostles. In so doing, they strengthen the roots of their faith; and roots, as we know, are the source of life-giving sustenance. In that sense, pilgrims to Rome should always feel at home here, and the 'Domus Australia' will play an important part in creating a home for Australian pilgrims in the city of the Apostles. Yet roots are only a part of the story. According to a saying attributed to a great poet from my own country, Johann Wolfgang van Goethe, there are two things that children should receive from their parents: roots and wings. From our holy Mother, the Church, we too receive both roots and wings: the faith of the Apostles, handed down from generation to generation, and the grace of the Holy Spirit, conveyed above all through the Sacraments of the Church."

Thus, the Holy Father concluded, "Pilgrims to this city return to their homelands renewed and strengthened in their faith, and borne aloft by the Holy Spirit in the journey onward and upward to their heavenly home".

Next week-end we will take up the collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD). CCHD was founded 40 years ago by the bishops of the United States when they realized that the lives of those in need would not improve until the systems and policies that keep people in poverty were changed.
